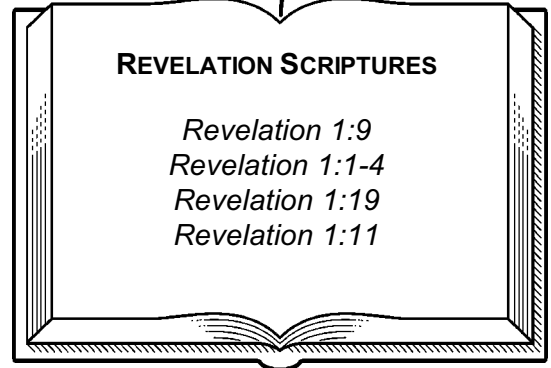

- Philadelphia (A.D. 1880 – 1930)

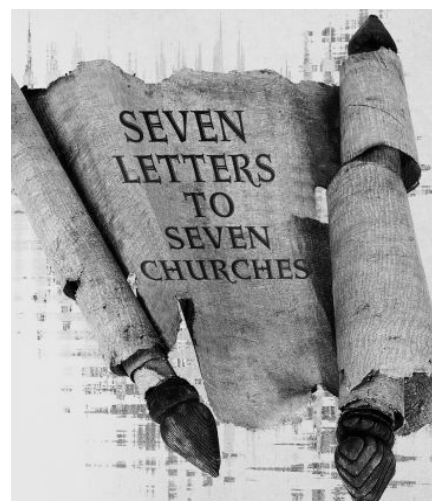
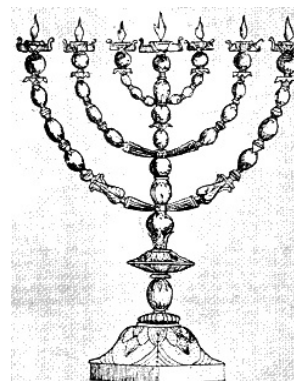
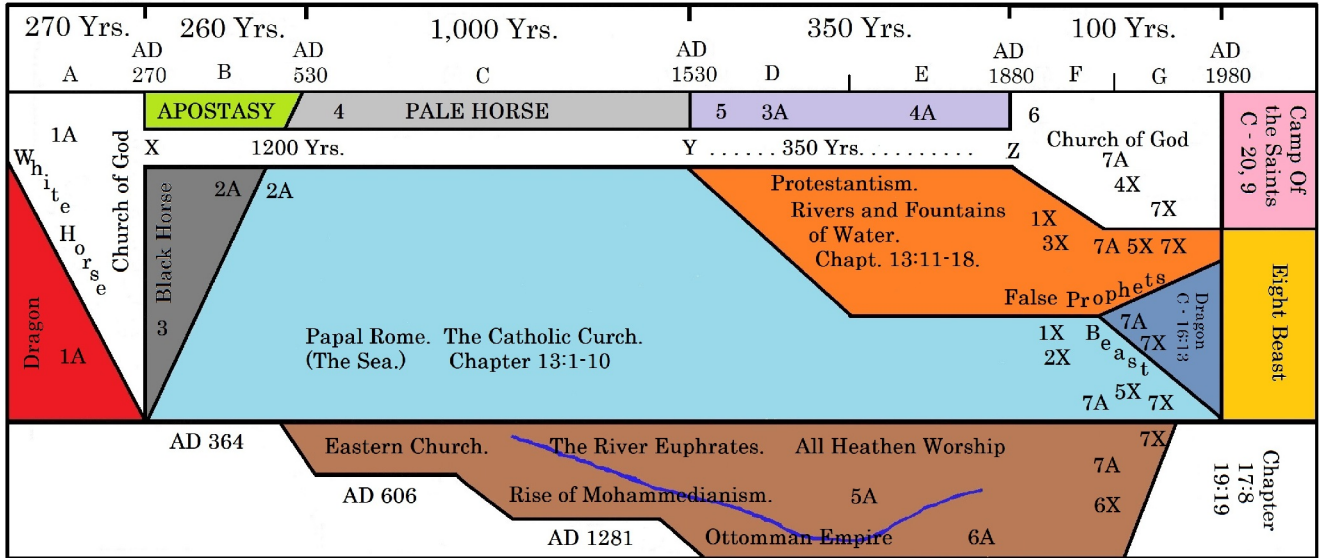


CHART EXPLANATION OF THE REVELATION

With the Opening of the Last Seal

The seven seals are located on the chart with Figures 1-2-3-4-5-6-7.
 The seven churches of Asia, placed through gospel day, with A-B-C-D-E-F-G.
 Seven trumpets sound on movements located with 1A-2A-3A-4A-5A-6A-7A.
 Seven vials poured out on movements located with 1X-2X-3X-4X-5X-6X-7X.
 Woman together with two witnesses went into wilderness located with X.
 Two witnesses killed located with Y and stood up located with Z.

From the Preface: In the year A.D. 1930 I wrote and mailed a small booklet, Chart Explanation of the Revelation, to the ministry of the Church of God for their consideration, asking that they might study the line of thought contained therein with me. Some gave the booklet some study and consideration, and through their cooperation and the help of the Lord, deeper thoughts regarding the Revelation have been arrived at. Sixteen months past I conceived an idea of having a hand-painted chart made covering the entire book of the Revelation.

THE REVELATION CHART DEPICTS PROPHECY – OLD TESTAMENT & NEW TESTAMENT
